Gordon W. Lathrop

Gordon W. Lathrop is Professor of Liturgy Emeritus at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia. During the years 2006-2009, he has also been Visiting Professor of Liturgical Studies in Yale Divinity School. A pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, he is the author of several books, including *Holy Things: A Liturgical Theology* (Fortress 1993), *Holy People: A Liturgical Ecclesiology* (Fortress 1999), *Holy Ground: A Liturgical Cosmology* (Fortress 2003), *The Pastor: A Spirituality* (Fortress 2006), and, with Lorraine S. Brugh, *The Sunday Assembly* (Augsburg Fortress 2008). He was a participant in the preparation of the North American liturgical resource *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* (2006). He has lectured widely in several countries and participated in the work of the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches and the Worship and Culture Study of the Lutheran World Federation. He is an Editorial Consultant of the journal *Worship* (Collegeville). In 1985 he was the President of the North American Academy of Liturgy and in 2006 he received that professional organization's *Berakah Award*. He is also President-Elect of Societas Liturgica, the international society of scholars in liturgy, and will serve as President of that Society in 2011-2013. His academic formation took place at Occidental College, Los Angeles (BA 1961), Luther Seminary, St. Paul (BD 1966) and Katholieke Universiteit, Nijmegen, Netherlands (DTh, 1969).
